Hong Kong located at the southeastern of Pearl River Port, and has developed into an international trading port and entrepôt with its strategic location and Victoria Harbour.


In the urban area, there is a convenient, safe and efficient public transport system, with subways, buses, taxis, cable cars, trams, and ferry for sightseeing.
